Who can participate?

The challenge is designed for all students and young professionals around the world. Only one entry per team is allowed i.e. a participant cannot enter through two or more teams.

Can individuals apply?

This challenge requires participants to work in teams. In the case that you do not have a team, you can still register and we will connect you to other individuals also looking for a team.

Is the challenge online?

Yes, the challenge is 100% online.

Can individuals based outside of Spain participate?

Yes, the challenge is open to everyone around the world.

We aim to make the deadlines and live presentation timings as accessible as possible to participants and key partners in different time zones. When you register for the challenge, you will be asked to let us know your timezone to take the distribution of time zones into account.

Can participants in one team come from different universities or countries?

Yes, team members can come from different backgrounds, disciplines, and geographic locations and participate in one team.

We aim to make the deadlines and live presentation timings as accessible as possible to participants and key partners in different time zones. However, for your group work, you will decide amongst your team when the best times for meetings would be.

Is there a maximum number of teams that can apply from each school?

No, there is no limit to the number of teams coming from one university.

ETHICS & INTEGRITY CHALLENGE 2020

What kind of time commitment is required for the challenge?

The number of hours put in depends on the scope and depth of the project each team delivers. You will have seven days to complete the report and, if the team qualifies to present in front of the panel, four days to prepare the presentation.

Does each team member have to submit an individual paper submission?

No, only one report is required per team. You can check the deliverable requirements [here](#).

Is there a specific template or format needed for the report?

There are no set criteria for the report. Teams can submit their reports in any way they see fit as long as it is no longer than three pages.

What kind of presentation tools are allowed for presentations?

Teams can use any tools or applications but will need to send a PDF format of their presentation the day before presenting.

The presentations will take place via Zoom Webinar, where at least one of the team members must have the same presentation file ready to connect and share through their screens.

When will the participants find out which teams have qualified for the presentations round?

Five days after the paper submissions or as soon as all the judges have graded all the reports, we will email all the participants informing them if they have or have not qualified for the presentations round.

When will the participants find out which team has won the challenge?

The winners of the challenge will be announced at the end of the webinar, after the five finalist teams and keynote speaker have presented.
