Travel Documentation for non-EU students.

Although we are currently living in exceptional circumstances, immigration laws still apply to non-EU citizens. Thus, those who wish to travel during Winter Break should keep their legal documentation up-to-date. Entry into Spain from a country or zone at risk.

Since November 23, 2020, all individuals who want to enter Spain from a countries or area listed as at-risk in <u>this publication of Spain's Official State Bulletin</u>, must have a Diagnostic Test for Active Infection (PDIA) for SARS-CoV-2 with a negative result, carried out in the 72 hours prior to arrival in Spain. There are three types of PDIA: **PCR tests, TMA** (Transcription-Mediated Amplification) and **RT-LAMP** (Reverse Transcriptase Loop-Mediated Isothermal Amplification)

Upon entering Spain, the individual must demonstrate having taken this test, with a negative result, and will therefore not need to respect a quarantine period upon arrival.

The at-risk list of countries and areas will be reviewed every 15 days and updated on the website of Spain's <u>Ministry of Health.</u>

Recommendations from travel agencies

Government restrictions

- Continuous verification is recommended before departure and during the trip.
- Verify the requisites for crossing the borders of the departure/arrival/layover-stopover country, as well as the requisites for return to the country of origin.
- Some countries are restricting the return of national and international travellers who have visited specific destinations.
- Be in contact with origin/destination **consular services** and your travel provider.

Country-specific restrictions that passengers need to follow at the airport and onboard the aircraft Link

Personalised passport and visa advice based on your personal details and itinerary. Check if your travel documents are sufficient <u>Link</u>.

Health requirements (Test and declaration forms)

- Verify the requirements with the local/health authority, depending on where you are flying.
